Acronychia oblongifolia - Common Acronychia	A small to medium rainforest tree with striking bright white fruit that is produced during autumn and winter. A good food source for birds and can be eaten by humans, although they are quite acid. 12m	5-12m
Acronychia pubescens - Hairy acronychia	Fast growing and adaptable tree with broad, furry, trifoliolate leaves, white flowers and clear yellow aromatic fruits with a sweet, refreshing and fragrant flavour. Prefers good soil and protection from frost.	4-10m
Acronychia wilcoxiana - Silver Aspen	Bushy small tree with dark, shiny leaves and pretty white edible fruit. Hardy in coastal areas in full sun, provided water is available.	3-8m
Alectryon coriaceus - Beach Alectryon	Shrub or small tree with bushy, light-green foliage, cream flowers and eye-catching, bird-attractive, red & black fruit. Hardy in coastal conditions and moderately fast growing.	1-6m
Alphitinia petrea - Pink Ash	Very fast small to medium tree. Excellent pioneer species with open crown of rounded green leaves with silver backs. Bird attractive. Full sun.	8m
Alpinea coerulea - Native Ginger	A versatile plant for Aboriginal people. The ginger tasting roots were eaten and the flesh from the bright blue fruit. The large leaves were thatched and used to make shelters and to wrap food for cooking. 2m Brilliant red under leaf.	2m
Aristolochia praevenosa - Richmond Birdwing Vine	A vine of temperate subtropical rainforests. The vine attracts one of the largest and most spectacular butterflies and is considered an endangered species. Plants require support on which to climb, a trellis, a fence or over a stump.	Vine
Arystera distylis - Twin-leaved Coogera	Small tree, with showy pink new leaf growth in winter, fruits are developed in summer and are bird attracting. Hardy once established.	6-7m
Austromyrtus dulcis - Midjim	A low spreading shrub with dainty foliage developing a reddish shade in colder climates. The white tea tree like flowers are followed by sweet edible mauve-white speckled berries. A very decorative groundcover.	0.5m
Cissus antarctica - Water Vine	Great ground cover or screening plant that is very hardy, however looks its best when watered and feed well. Common food source for rainforest pigeons in late summer.	Vine
Cordyline petiolaris - Broad leaved palm lily	This is an excellent container plant with unusual foliage. It may be multi-planted for good effect but needs a good big pot to reduce the risk of being blown over in the wind. An under story rainforest plant. 2m	4m
Cordyline stricta - Narrow-leaved palm lily	Medium shrub found in all major types of rainforest north of Sydney to the McPherson Range. An elegant plant with purple to black fruit, well suited to smaller gardens to create a lushious rainforest feeling	3m
Cryptocarya laevigata - Glossy Laurel	A native rainforest shrub appearing in subtropical rainforests north of Lismore. A highly ornamental tree with dark, glossy foliage and bunches of small, yellow flowers followed by striking bright-red fruit.	4m
Cupaniopsis anacardioides - Tuckeroo	An attractive, fast growing and hardy small to medium tree well suited to coastal areas. Good wildlife food source. Makes a excellent street tree or pioneer in reforestation.	9m
Cupaniopsis parvifolia - Small leaved Tuckeroo	A hardy small tree with a spreading crown creating good shade. Small panicles of pale flowers are followed by bird-attracting fruits. Tough in drier sites, reasonably fast requiring little care.	6-9m
Davidsonia pruriens var jerseyana - Davidson's Plum	An outstanding small tree that prefers warm conditions and some shade. Striking edible purple fruits that make excellent jam. The var. jerseyana is the southern form which is generally a larger plant than its the northern var. pruriens.	8m
Davidsonia pruriens - Davidsons Plum	Outstanding small tree for warm position or indoors. Large pinnate leaves & many-trunked habit make it a striking specimen plant. The edible purple fruits make excellent jam. Prefers some shade.	8m
Dianella caerulea - Blue flax-lily	An evergreen tuft-forming perennial. Produces panicles of small star-shaped flowers in summer. Flowers followed by blue berries.	0.5-1m
Diploglottis campbelli - Small leaf tamarind	Small to medium sized tree with dense crown. Fruit is a light brown thin-walled capsule to 6cm across containing seeds enclosed in a fleshy aril. Can be kept as a neat and attractive compact rainforest tree	10-12m

Erythrina vespertilio - Batswing coral	Scarlet pea-flowers in spring occur usually when the tree is leafless. Birds are attracted to the showy flowers. 6 to 10 metres	5-10m
Ficus coronata - Sandpaper fig	This small fig occurs along watercourses in Rainforest and open areas. An attractive tree with sandpapery leaves and edible fruit. Grows densely in full sun, less so in shade. Very good for stream bank stabilisation.	6-10m
Glochidion ferdinandi - Cheese Tree	Fast growing bushy tree with spreading crown of smooth shining leaves. Pretty foliage and red fruits shaped like miniature round cheeses that are highly attractive to birds. A hardy pioneer tree which looks best in full sun.	6-8m
Hicksbeachia pinnatifolia - Red Bopple Nut	An attractive spreading tree with glossy leaflets. Flowers are insignificant. Showy fruits occur during winter and are two-lobed, yellow or red with large black seeds.	7m
Hymnosporum flavum - Native frangipani	Masses of yellow or white flowers that are heavily scented in Spring and beautiful dark green foliage. The fruit is a brown, greasy-looking capsule covered in hairs, and splits in the middle to release papery brown seeds. 15m	6-10m
Lomandra hysterix - Forest Mat Rush	An under story plant that can be used as a bush food. The base of the stems are eaten with leaves being used to make baskets.	1m
Lomandra longifolia - Mat Rush	A grass-like plant with dense tussocks of narrow straplike leaves from deep green to bluish green. Yellow and cream blossoms have a delightful honey smell.	1m
Macaranga tanarius	Very fast growing, vigorous tree for exposed sites. The broad heart shaped leaves are distinctive and ornamental. Suitable for shelterbelts, initial rainforest regeneration and as a background foliage plant in the garden.	4-6m
Melastoma affine - Blue Tongue	Widespread native, very attractive bushy shrub with dark green leaves and large pink to mauve flowers over many months. Also produces sweet edible blue black berries. Very hardy. Often confused with the exotic tibouchina.	2m
Melicope elleryana - Pink Euodia	Small to medium sized tree with dense crown. Fruit is a light brown thin-walled capsule to 6cm across containing seeds enclosed in a fleshy aril.	5-8m
Neolitsea dealbata - White Bolly Gum	A striking feature of this under story tree are the young white drooping leaves that are covered in dense rusty coloured hairs. Mature leaves are so glossy that the wax can be melted from the leaves under heat. 15m	10m
Omalanthus nutans - Native Bleeding Heart	A shrub or small tree with soft green leaves above and grey/green underneath. The mature leaves often turn a dark red. The two-lobed bluish capsular fruits ripen from December through to March. 6m	5-6m
Pittosporum rhombifolium - QLD Holly	Hardy and reliable attractive tree. Spectacular when the whole crown turns white with masses of flowers in summer, followed by three months of bright orange fruits. Neatly pyramidal in shape.	5-8m
Pittosporum undulatum - Australian Daphne	A popular Aust. Species with a wide dome reaching up to 12 metres. Produces profuse clusters of creamy white, bell-shaped flowers in spring. Prefers moderate to warm climates.	5-8m
Rhodomyrtus psidioides (S/T) - Native Guava	A small dense shrub, with white/pink flowers appearing in clusters in Spring or Summer. The leaves have a sweet, fruity smell when crushed and are unusually glossy below. Fast-growing and hardy in most conditions. Tolerate light frosts.	2-6m
Sarcopteryx stipitata - Steelwood	A dainty small tree or large shrub with fine pointed leaves which are a beautiful bright pink colour when new. Suitable for tub-growing and as a shade tree. Fruits are red with black seeds and are bird-attractive. Hardy in sun or shade.	6-8m
Syzygium paniculata select - Magenta Cherry	Most popular native hedging plant in Aust. Attractive dense glossy new growth. Also edible fruit.	3m
Syzygium australe - Scrub Cherry	A medium tree with dense foliage, reddish growth tips and bright red or pink edible fruits. Hardy in most conditions if ample water is provided. Tolerates full sun and some frost.	5-20m
Syzygium luehmanii - Riberry	An attractive shade and specimen tree. New pink to red growth with creamy white flowers followed by coral-red, pear shaped edible fruit.	6-20m
Syzygium wilsonii - Powderpuff lillypilly	Small to medium pendulous shrub to 3m high. New foliage is a very attractive bright pink. Flowers are large and crimson occurring in large fluffy heads.	2-3m

Tabernaemontana pandacai - Banana Bush	An under story plant native to mid north NSW to North QLD. Appreciates good light but not direct sun. These pretty yellow fruits resemble tiny bananas however they are not edible.	1-4m
Toechima dasyrrhache	Small tidy tree with slender trunk and compact crown. Red fruits are bird attractive. Suitable as a street tree. Hardy in full sun.	8-10m
Xanthostemon chrysanthus - Golden penda	A highly ornamental tree with beautiful yellow flowers with prominent anthers occurring in winter. Beautiful glossy green leaves.	10m
